Principal's Report

Update provided by Renee Cameron:

- Playground-all pea stone waiting to get churned. In summer of 2024, too hard to rototill. In the fall, all playground surfaces failed the inspection. This led to an increase cost for junior climber as new surface was not in grant request. The new junior climber has had an architect hired by KPR add to the plan existing drainage under the surface. KPR facilities will review if current playground curbing can stay. KPR will assess whether an arborist is required to make clearance for the new structures height. A question was asked about why the grant did not cover the new surface. At the time, the grant was given a quote with TBD for pea stone and an estimate for the new surface was not known until after the grant. In the future, we can request quotes for all playground to be resurfaced as KPR will no longer use pea stone. With weather pea stone turns the surface to a solid like cement. Pam shared that she was given an installation date of late May.
- PA Day- Literacy Focus continues with Elements of Writing and how to teach writing. We are using The Writer's Revolution and The Writing Rope which is the foundation for our Language curriculum. AI focus about how to use this as an educator. The board uses Microsoft Co-pilot. Vaping information for Educators will be shared and connections to the local Health Unit for support starting in grade 4. Presentation from our KPR Indigenous Consultant about the 7 Principles of Indigenous Education. The principles are posted in each KPR school. Ours is near the office.
- Events: Jimmy Chapman rescheduled to May 5 due to Ice Days/Power Out, Earth Day April 29, Spelling Bee April 29,
- Questions for School Council: Is school council continuing to purchase the grade 6 celebration shirt for \$15.00 each? This has been done since 2020 and worn as part of their clap out. Each year (but last) school council purchases the Grade 1-5 awards (\$400) and Grade 6 awards (\$400), will this continue? Council was adjourned in the spring last year so the vote was not in the minutes.
